What We Need From You

1. **Accuracy.** Coin values, dates, mintages, and key-date details must be verified against reputable sources (PCGS Price Guide / CoinFacts, NGC, U.S. Mint). Never estimate or invent a value — flag anything you're unsure of instead of guessing.
2. **Plain-English writing.** Our reader inherited a collection or found coins in a drawer. No unexplained jargon.
3. **Reliability.** Consistent weekly delivery on the agreed schedule.

Process

1. Articles submitted as Google Docs on an agreed weekly schedule.
2. Every article is reviewed by our founder (a licensed dealer with a background at a major rare coin auction house) before publication. Revision requests for factual corrections are a normal part of the process.
3. Repeated factual errors (invented values, wrong key dates, unverified claims) end the arrangement.
